A note to keep in mind: U.S. 'cup' sizes are a little smaller than the metric cups used elsewhere which are 250ml.

- If your play dough is too wet, add a little flour.
- If your play dough is too dry, add a little oil.
- Wrap play dough in cling wrap when not in use to keep it from drying out.
